How is it possible to tabulate the love that comes out of our faithful community and is delivered into our world. But, here goes...

Our 8 adopted Angel Tree families – that included 28 children and 8 moms – didn't get everything that was on their lists, but they did request and receive the following gifts, some of which may surprise you: bath towel sets (7 families, 31 sets); toilet paper (4 families); sheet/comforter sets (6 families, 12 children); blankets (3 families); diapers (3 families); fishing tackle (1 family, 2 children); Paper towels (2 families); cleaning supplies (3 families); robes (7 children, 1 family); hoodies/jackets/coats (14 children); shoes/boots (9 children); shirts/sweaters (13 children); pants (14 children); 12 Gift Cards to McDonalds, Chipotle, Roblox, Walmart, Bath & Body Works, Steak & Shake, and Columbia Mall; and a wonderful assortment of toys and household items – some of which are: wireless headphones, science experiment kit, nerf gun, African American doll, building blocks, Spiderman night light, fire fighter costume, pots & pans, Barbie dolls, blender, silverware, microwave oven, kitchen utensils, personal hygiene supplies. In addition to these gifts, each family received a laundry basket, a big tin of popcorn, and an Aldi gift card valued at \$30 for each member of their family.



Caring for God's Good Creation

As the new year begins, Olivet's Sustainable Living Team is planning a variety of programs and events. A **Bird Walk** at Eagle Bluffs Conservation Area with Melina Matheney of Missouri River Bird Observatory has been scheduled for **Saturday, April 18th**. According to State Ornithologist Kristen Heath-Acre, this should be a good time to see both song birds and shore birds. This event builds on interest generated by our Bird Walk last fall at the 3M Flat Branch-Hinkson Creek Wetlands Trail.

We hope to offer a **book discussion series** during **Eastertide ... April 12th – May 17th**. Watch for more information in Olivet's February newsletter.

Seeds 'n Sprouts is scheduled for **Sunday, April 26th**. We plan to offer specialty tomato and pepper seedlings, select annual flowers, herbs and native plants all grown by volunteers. Donations are gratefully accepted to offset cost of supplies.

We also start plants for Olivet's landscape beds, including our Children's Garden, and grow tomato and pepper seedlings for the Interfaith Community Garden, a cooperative effort by Newman Center and Congregation Beth Shalom. Last year the Garden raised 1,670 pounds of produce distributed to persons in need, primarily through the Food Bank Market.

The annual **Spring Property Work Day** is currently scheduled for **Saturday, May 2nd**, when Olivet's Property Team will lead us in planting annual flowers, adding native plants where needed, mulching trees and watering new plantings.

Visit the Sustainable Living Team's Table at Olivet's upcoming **Opportunity Fair** on **Sunday, January 25th** to ask questions and make suggestions. We look forward to seeing you then.

A Calendar Overview of 2026

In late fall of each year, Olivet's Program Council looks toward the new year's scheduling of events. Dates are set for the ENTIRE YEAR so that event conflicts will be held to a minimum. Many events are set by the liturgical calendar - the church year calendar that tells us when Lent begins, or where Easter will fall. Other events - particularly those of the local church - must be scheduled by the Program Council.

The Program Council meets via Zoom, approximately quarterly, to plan for events, discuss ways to improve Olivet's experiences, and look toward the future. If this sounds intriguing to you, you can "drop in" on the next Zoom meeting Monday evening, January 19th, at 5:30p.m.

The November 2025 Olivet Church Board Meeting was called to order by President Karen Broz at 7:01 pm. Reverend Hannah opened the meeting with a prayer.

New 2026 board members were welcomed as non-voting guests.

Additions to the Agenda:

- Old Business – Update on the parking lot letter
- New Business – Proposed cell tower on Olivet property
- Motion to approve additions made by Jim Spain, seconded by Rita Reeder; motion passed.

The minutes for the October 2025 board meeting were reviewed and approved.

Financial Reports

The Financial Reports for October 2025 were presented by Jason Enright. The Balance Sheet, Cash on Hand Reports, and the Budget vs Actual for October were reviewed. Chris Valleroy moved to approve the financial report with correction noted in the discussion and an updated report submitted, Joyce Mast seconded the motion; motion passed.

- There was a miscalculation on the income on the budget to actual report. The report should show the budget short by \$9,803.82, not \$20,000. Jason will update the report.
- Discussion on the request from last board meeting to have the font size to make the report easier to read. Jason will work with the contractor to make the reports more condensed and easier to read.

Finance Chairperson, Kenneth Bartley reported October finances

- Need to break out sources of income for future reports
- Income is up \$11,406 in October putting the church in the black financially.
- Discussion occurred regarding interest in seeing the reports be simplified to make them easier to understand.

Minister Reports

Reverend Natalie Dixon Crewell

- The hayride went well this year with about 50 people attending
- Attended the second community organizing training meeting with the Faith and Solidarity group.
- The Grace Expansion team is making progress
- Toured the Opportunity Campus recently
- The theme for Advent this year is “What Do You Fear”.
- Have been working with the Shepherds with discussions on caretaker burn out.

Reverend Hannah Ryan

- Church youth completed the Angel Tree gift shopping last Friday
- The children’s Christmas play will be recorded this coming Saturday.
- Planning is in process for Advent.
- Working stewardship letter and end of year financial statements
- Attended a preaching retreat in Arizona
- Attended an ordination at Broadway Christian Church

Unfinished Business

- Policy updates:
 - ⇒ The team has not met recently.
 - ⇒ Making plans to have someone come in to review building security
 - ⇒ The policy team would like approval to create a secondary team to review and recommend updates to the finance policies. Justin Walensky moved to approve the request, Chris Valleroy seconded, and the motion passed.
- Update on the parking lot letter
 - ⇒ The letter discussed in a previous meeting was hand delivered to the old

church

- ⇒ A telephone discussion was held with the church's minister regarding Olivet's concerns.
- ⇒ Also discussed the potential that they may not be able to use the parking lot if Olivet's congregation grows enough to need the entire parking lot.

New Business

- Review of Finances Report – Audit Review Team, Linda Reed Brown and Nancy Foss
 - ⇒ The team's report for 2024 includes several recommendations.
 - ⇒ The policy team has recommended that a group be set up to update finance policies.
 - ⇒ Recommendations were not a preconceived list but based on questions that arose during the review process.
 - ⇒ Audits are supposed to be done annually, but have not been done for several years.
 - ⇒ The audit team approach was to protect the congregation and the people handling money.
 - ⇒ Discussion was tabled until the December 2025 meeting
- Cervinka Fund Use for 2025 – Linda Reed Brown
 - ⇒ Funds from this bequest are to be used by the Outreach Team for crisis situations in the church's ministries.
 - ⇒ Outreach can now use these funds to: provide additional food support for families as result of government shutdown, has decided to provide \$1,250 for Faith and Solidarity to support food outreach for local families.
- Property Update –Karen Broz
 - ⇒ Additional insulation has been added to the attic at an expense of \$4,720. The church can expect to save approximately \$600 to \$800 per year on utility bills. Project is consistent with the church's Green Chalice efforts.
 - ⇒ The old pews have been sold for \$2,000
 - ⇒ Improving the sound system in the sanctuary.
 - ⇒ Widening the east driveway.
- New board Officers for 2026 Needed – Karen Broz
 - ⇒ Karen and Chris will start recruiting board officers for 2026.
- Proposed cell tower on Olivet property – Dave Mast
 - ⇒ A cell tower company has approached the church about putting a 180-foot-tall cell tower on church property along with a small building and a fence surrounding the tower and building.
 - ⇒ Two options have initially been proposed by the company: 1) a 99-year lease for a one-time payment of \$100,000; or 2) a 50 year lease for \$650 per month (with the right to cancel the lease).

- ⇒ Verizon will be the anchor company; other cell phone companies could use the tower in the future with additional fees.
- ⇒ Has attempted to contact owners of neighboring properties who have also been contacted by the same company.
- ⇒ Only place they can put the tower on Olivet's property is on the north side of pavilion.
- ⇒ Will need an easement for a road to access the tower.
- ⇒ Dave has a drawing of where the tower can be placed. He will send the drawing to Karen.
- ⇒ This will have positive benefits to the neighborhood by expanding cell service in the local community.
- ⇒ Motion made to allow the property committee to enter into good faith negotiations with Horvath Company for the placement of a cell tower on Olivet property, and bring a contract back to the board for approval by Jim Spain, seconded by Justin Walensky; motion passed.

The board meeting adjourned at 8:33 pm.
