YOUR OUTREACH TEAM HAS BEEN BUSY ON YOUR BEHALF!

- Collected 36 coats, 33 gloves & mittens, 57 hats and scarfs, 152 pairs of socks, and 22 miscellaneous other warm clothing items for The Wardrobe in October
- Served 150 friends and family a scrumptious Thanksgiving Dinner on Nov 10
- Served 120 meals on Nov 4 and 163 meals on Dec 2 to guests at Loaves and Fishes Soup Kitchen
- Collected Christmas gifts and grocery gift cards (worth \$1,080) and delivered them to 8 families through the Voluntary Action Angel Tree Holiday Program
- Granted an emergency grant of \$300 from our Hands On Ministry funds to CoMo Mobile Aid Collective to purchase coveralls, handwarmers, and warm socks for people who are "on the streets" all day during the winter
- Dinner in celebration of Bill Matthews' life for approximately 50 family and friends
- Shared 20 live Poinsettias and 9 "virtual" poinsettia greetings to neighbors and friends on Dec15

PARTNER UPDATES:

Voluntary Action Center – Alesha's life quickly went from stable to the brink of homelessness. "Before the crisis, I was working," Alesha says. "I was able to provide for my children without assistance. I was self-sufficient at that point. Then life happened."

Alesha came to VAC and received a warm welcome and resources for assistance that she worked hard to take advantage of. Now, several years later, Alesha has made great strides in improving life for herself and her 3 children. She has a good job and pride in herself and her work.

In the midst of a crisis, basic needs do not feel so basic... they are enormous, insurmountable, and a person feels hopeless. Olivet's partnership with VAC becomes acts of love and empowerment. Thanks, Olivet for your generosity to the VAC assistance fund called the FISH FUND.

CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocates – "When CASA volunteers come, they don't come with any prejudices in their heart. They pay atten-

tion, observe everything. Their care helps lessen the trauma and hardships that being in foster care has on children."

Brothers Liam, Ben, and Noah spent six long years in foster care, separated from each other. Liam, the oldest, was nearing the time when he would age out of the systems without a permanent family. CASA Mark, however, was relentless in his work on the boys' behalf. And finally, the boys were reunited in the home of their grandparents – something that had once seemed impossible.

And now they are awaiting their adoption day! Thanks, Olivet for your generosity to CASA, helping provide more volunteers to children like these brothers.

The Food Bank – Across Missouri, thousands of children and their families lack access to a reliable, nutrient -rich diet, but The Food Bank's School Market Program is adapting to this need in new ways. For children, short - and long-term food insecurity have impacts that extend far beyond hunger to health and learning challenges.

The Food Bank began the Buddy Pack program in 2005, which supplies prepacked single-serving foods to help keep children fed over weekends. School Markets take a different approach. Rather than proving single servings in a pack that served one student, the new School Market offers larger packages of food that can serve a child and their family with items needed for family-style meals.

Students and families get to select the foods they want to take home, offering the dignity of CHOICE. Thanks, Olivet for your generosity to The Food Bank, keeping food and creative services available to families across central Missouri.

One Home One Future

One Home One Future is a coalition effort of many US faith denominations and organizations for visible and collective creation care, and just and equitable climate solutions. This initiative includes Christian, Jewish and Muslim faith communities and organizations. One Home One Future calls people of all faiths to stand together in caring for this beautiful blue-green planet we all call Home.

Each congregation or organization sets their own priorities and creates programming and chooses activities that fit their spirit and values and that build on their strengths and gifts. Our denomination, The Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) and the Disciples Green Chalice program are among the leaders of this effort.

This past October, Olivet's Sustainable Living Team recommended to our Board that Olivet, a Green Chalice congregation, participate in this initiative. It aligns with Olivet's Vision Statement for 2023-2026, affirms the work of our Property & Sustainable Living Teams, and offers many resources for education and action. Plus, it can connect us to other participating congregations, such as St. Andrew's Lutheran Church, an ELCA congregation here in Columbia, to enable us to learn from one another and encourage joint programing. Treasurer Diane Bartley, and Ken Bartley were present.

The November 18, 2024, Olivet Church Board Meeting was called to order by President Karen Broz at 7:01 pm. Reverend Natalie opened the meeting with a prayer.

John made a motion to approve the minutes for October 2024. Chris seconded the motion and it passed.

Financial Reports

The Financial Reports for October 2024 were presented by Diane Bartley. The Balance Sheet, Cash on Hand Reports, and the Budget vs Actual for October were reviewed. Chris made a motion to approve the financial report. David seconded the motion and it passed.

Finance Chairperson, Kenneth Bartley reported October best month of the year for 2024- and second-best month for ministry fund gifts. August was the best month for ministry fund gifts. Let us celebrate this win. Year to year document shows ministry funds gifts up 9%, dividends and interest are up 9.8%. The old church income (rent) has increased from last year by \$12,000. Expenses were up 8% from last year. Fall BBQ income/expenses has not been included yet.

Minister Reports

Reverend Natalie Dixon Crewell reported her, and Hannah had finished the stewardship program that was wonderful. Travel with family to officiate a wedding. Working on the homecoming worship experience, which went well. Also working on conversations with people to join the Shepards team. Getting new Shepherds ready to start in January. The continuing education on grief counseling will start the monthly meetings for Natalie to attend and learn more about.

Reverend Hannah reported for Christian Education the class Larry Brown was teaching ended on November 3rd and he had twenty-four participants in the class. Many others read the book. The older elementary class are beginning a new curriculum for advent. Tony and Tracy Keel and Hannah went angel tree shopping with five youth. The money raised in February was put towards adopting a family for the holidays. They purchased gifts for a family of five members. Natalie and Hannah put together a reflective resource for those who want to process emotions from the election. Next is getting ready for advent, the theme is words from the beginning. We will be working with Sanctified Art again so there will be devotionals, advent calendars and more communal art. Along with the choir cantata, blue Christmas service, children's Christmas program and Christmas eve service.

Unfinished Business

One Home One Future - board members had time to review documents/websites presented from October. Sarah made a motion based on the recommendation of Olivet's Sustainable Living Team, I move that the Olivet Board approve Olivet's participation in One Home One Future, a national, multi-denominational creation care initiative for positive climate action. Chris seconded the motion and it passed.

Finance Team - met in October. Working on a review of the books but waiting on the books to close. Looking into outsource resources for treasury responsibilities. The team will not meet again until January. Questions about how we are managing the future cost of the property (painting, parking lot etc.); how we are planning for these expenses, will be taken back to the finance team to look at and consider.

Policy/Procedure Manual Update Team- the current manual is on flash drives for team members.
