Turn the Super Bowl into a SOUP-er Bowl on February 8!

Sunday, February 8 is the Super Bowl of football... and Olivet will acknowledge that monumental event by doing a **SOUPER BOWL OF CARING**.

What does this mean? It's a special Sunday when we ask that you add a few extra items to your grocery shopping list and bring them for a local food pantry. For years, we've been *helping to tackle hunger in Columbia, because hunger doesn't take a game day holiday*.

What's the "goal"? Since 2022, we've collected 809 pounds of food. *Can we reach 191 pounds to make it an even 1,000 this year???*

What to bring? Most desired foods are canned meat (tuna, salmon, chicken, ham, beef, stew), boxed entrees (Mac & Cheese and "helper mixes" like Hamburger Helper), cereal (dry or instant oatmeal), and bread mixes (cornbread, muffins, biscuits).

The Wisdom of the Hive: What Honeybees Can Teach Us About Collective Wellbeing

**Sunday morning discussion series – Eastertide,
April 12 – May 17, 9:00 AM**

“Save the Bees” – it’s a mantra we know well. Threats to bees include habitat loss, pervasive pesticide and herbicide use, parasites & pathogens, climate change adversely affecting plant bloom times, invasive plant species and the list goes on.

But what if bees could actually be instrumental in saving us? What can we learn about their behaviors that could help us better listen to and take care of each other and our communities? Are there any behaviors that would not be beneficial for us?

Richard Edgar, beekeeper & Olivet SL Team member, will start our series with an introduction to bees & beekeeping and share his experience and observations.

Authors Johnson and Burtaine are also backyard beekeepers, friends and colleagues who have worked with groups to expand racial equity. As we continue with the book, we'll explore their premise that the hive can serve as a metaphor for our communities and consider attitudes and practices that can benefit us all. Several short chapters include meditations, poetry and mindfulness exercises.

The December 15, 2025, Olivet Church Board Meeting was called to order by President Karen Broz at 7:00 pm. Reverend Hannah opened the meeting with a prayer.

The minutes for November 2025 board meeting were approved as written.

Financial Reports

The Financial Reports for November 2025 were presented by Jason Enright. The Balance Sheet, Cash on Hand Reports, and the Budget vs Actual for November were reviewed. Rita Reeder made a motion to approve the financial report. Chris Valleroy seconded the motion, and it passed.

- A revised Budget to Actual report for October was reviewed and discussed by the board.
- HR expenses were less than expected due to a missed pension payment. Adrienne is aware of the issue and trying to resolve it in the current fiscal year. Jason will check with Adrienne.

Finance Chairperson, Kenneth Bartley shared his November report.

- Expenses are more than \$13,000 more than income for the year to date.
- Ken reported on the status of brokerage accounts interest.
- The church is currently maintaining a four-month reserve in the ministry budget.

Minister Reports

Reverend Natalie Dixon Crewell

- Olivet hosted the Columbia Disciple clergy group to a soup brunch.
- The sanctuary decorations received positive feedback.
- The shepherds have been assisting with pastoral care
- Natalie will be taking the last Sunday in December as a day off.
- Planning is under way for the 2026 activities schedule.

Reverend Hannah Ryan

- Much time has been devoted to Advent planning
- The children's Christmas play will be recorded this coming Saturday.
- Recorded, assembled and edited the children's Christmas program. A total of 14 children and youth participated in this year's program. The youth will lead the worship this coming Sunday.
- A Blue Christmas service is scheduled for Dec. 12.
- The Vision Team met in November.
- Attended the Mid-American Regional Board meeting. Hannah is now serving on the Personnel Committee.
- Hannah will take time off from December 29 through February 4.

Unfinished Business

- Policy updates:
 - ⇒ We have a person scheduled to review the church's security policy
 - ⇒ The team plans to have the updates completed in 2026.
- Cell Tower Update
 - ⇒ David Mast has discussed the initial proposal with the company representative.
 - ⇒ The church asked for a one-time cash payment of \$155,000, or a monthly fee of \$700.00 with a 6% increase every five years
 - ⇒ The company has rejected the monthly option and counter-offered a one-time payment of

- ⇒ \$125,000. They also wanted to change the tower design.
- ⇒ The church has sent a counteroffer of \$145,000, but expressed the preference to keep the original design.
- ⇒ The company representative has visited the site and explained that the company is reviewing their budget.
- ⇒ The company will provide \$25,000 in an escrow account to cover removal of the tower and is required to carry liability insurance on the tower.
- Review Finances Report
- ⇒ The audit report and recommendations were reviewed and discussed.
 - ⇒ Most of the recommendations can be worked out with the current personnel.
 - ⇒ Two different policies give contradicting information regarding when giving statements should be sent out – this will need to be resolved.
 - ⇒ Joyce Mast made a motion to approve the report; Rita Reeder seconded the motion – motion passed.

New Business

- Election of New Board Officers for 2026
 - ⇒ Justin Walensky - Board Chair
 - ⇒ Jim Spain - Vice Chair
 - ⇒ John Cunning - Secretary
 - ⇒ Motion made by Carolyn Henry to elect the slate of officers; Chris Valleroy seconded the motion - motion passed.

The board meeting adjourned at 8:14 pm.
