The 67th Olivet Chicken BBQ will take place Saturday, June 14th from 3-6 PM. This year's event supports the Opportunity Campus, and the Olivet Ministry Fund. Adult tickets are \$15 in advance, \$17 at the door. Child tickets are \$5. We need everyone's help to make our BBQ a success! Sell your tickets, work a shift or two, bake some pies (or donate money to purchase pies), and stick around at the end to help cleanup.

A word about pies....

We offer 4 types of pies: apple, cherry, peach and pecan. While we love homemade pies, we are happy to accept store-bought pies. We do ask that all pies are at least 9 inches in diameter (larger pies are fine). We will also accept monetary donations to purchase pies. We will offer a pie-baking event Wednesday, June 11 at 5:30. All ages are welcome!

The March 17, 2025 Olivet Church Board Meeting was called to order by Chair Karen Broz at 7:01 pm. Reverend Natalie opened the meeting with a prayer.

Chair Karen Broz asked that the agenda item to consider the Finance Team's recommendation for outsourcing be moved up the agenda. Chris Valleroy made the motion, Carolyn Henry seconded; motion passed.

The minutes for the February 2025 board meeting were reviewed and approved.

Financial Reports

The Financial Reports for February 2025 were presented by Diane Bartley. The Balance Sheet, Cash on Hand Reports, and the Budget to Actual for February were reviewed. Chris Valleroy made a motion to approve the financial report. Joyce Mast seconded the motion. Motion passed.

- Cash on hand report corrections regarding funds used for painting project will be made in next month's report.
- Budget to actual better month than January.
- Rummage sale brought in \$5,900.

Finance Chairperson, Kenneth Bartley reported on February 2025.

- Details from the reports were presented and discussed.
- Dividend and interest income from a CD and a T bill that matured.

Finance Team Recommendation for Outsourcing Service.

- Karen Broz provided background on the process to develop the recommendation including who served on a group to decide what to outsource.
- The team agreed that they wanted to work with someone familiar with church finances.
- Diane Bartley plans to retire from her volunteer position as treasurer.

- Hiring an outside firm will allow for more effective checks and balances.
- Accounting duties were not included in the job description for the church Office Administrator. The Office Administrator prefers not to take on these additional duties for additional compensation.
- The team decided to recommend Douglas Anne Cartwright.
- Detailed discussion and questions followed concerning what services the firm would provide.
- The church plans to migrate data from the current Quick-Books system to a cheaper platform; it is a QuickBooks product made for churches. The firm will help with that data migration.
- The church will pay \$540.00 per month for the firm's services. Savings on other expenditures and increases in income will cover much of the cost of these services.
- Motion to approve made by Jim Spain, seconded by Mary Dewey. Motion passed.
- Discussion followed regarding a way to formally acknowledge the incredible contributions Diane Bartley has made to the church in her role as treasurer. A group will be formed to discuss the most appropriate way to proceed and bring a proposal back to the board.

Minister Reports

Reverend Natalie Dixon Crewell

- Have joined with an ecumenical group of clergy in the Columbia area to discuss how best to support their congregations. Plan to meet monthly.
- The grief group continues to meet regularly in Natalie's office
- This is the last month of her grief certificate course. Will complete the requirements this month.
- The shepherd group has grown from 4 to 8. The program has changed to allow the shepherds to work with situations they feel comfortable to address.
- Forming a new "get together" team that will help to plan events.
- Has spent time planning for Lent with various worship experiences through art.
- Holding staff work days.
- Working on planning for the float trip.

Reverend Hannah Ryan

- Prepared the sanctuary for lent with the help from members providing handprints for the handprint sheet.
- Have added a giant coloring sheet in Fellowship Hall.

Your sale of Olivet Christian Church Chicken BBQ tickets will change the way we address homelessness in our county!

For the first time in Boone County history, multiple agencies across Columbia will come together in one place to offer comprehensive services to our homeless neighbors.

SHELTER – approximately 30,174 square feet that will operate 24/7 and provide overnight sleeping accommodations for up to 150 adults, meals for 80 or more, laundry facilities, showers, secure personal property storage, kennel facilities, computer lab and case management resources, and day center resources to adult men and women experiencing chronic and unsheltered homelessness in Boone County.

RESOURCE CENTER – approximately 19,000 square feet that will provide wraparound services, office space for partner agencies, and the Voluntary Action Center offices. A medical clinic providing medical, mental health, dental, and substance abuse services is included in this space.

<u>COMMUNITY PARTNERS</u> – In addition to the 4 entities listed above, Community Partners identified as of March, 2025 include: Burrell Mental Health, Central Missouri Community Action, Central Missouri Humane Society, Clarity Healthcare, Columbia Center for Urban Agriculture, Compass Health Network, Job Point and Truman Veterans Administration Homeless Programs.
